

Nurse Supply and Education Statewide Summary

Community Demographic Information

According to 2019 U.S. Census estimates, 21,477,737 people reside in the state of Florida. The state has 67 counties divided into eight (8) regions, summarized in companion reports.

There are an estimated 163 LPNs, 678 RNs, and 65 APNs providing *direct care* per 100,000 people in the state.
