

Nurse Supply and Education West Central Region

Community Demographic Information

According to 2019 U.S. Census estimates, 4,927,762 people reside in the West Central region, including Desoto, Hardee, Hernando, Highlands, Hillsborough, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, and Sarasota counties – representing 22.9% of the Florida population.

24.6% of Florida's nursing workforce are in the West Central region. There are an estimated 188 LPNs, 709 RNs, and 62 APNs providing *direct care* per 100,000 people.
