

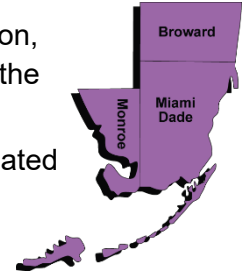


Nurse Supply and Education South Region

Community Demographic Information

According to 2019 U.S. Census estimates, 4,743,946 people reside in the South region, including Broward, Miami-Dade, and Monroe counties – representing 22.1% of the Florida population.

20.6% of Florida’s nursing workforce are in the South region. There are an estimated 124 LPNs, 652 RNs, and 80 APNs providing *direct care* per 100,000 people.
